They record ten periodicals (some weekly, some monthly and some quarterly), and provide the mass readings for Sundays and Feast days in all three formats. Mailing is free to and from people certified as blind (which can also include having partial vision or having difficulty dealing with traditional print because of other physical ailments, dyslexia or other impediments). The Xavier Society for the Blind is also the home of the Catholic Lending Library, with volumes that can be borrowed in all three formats.
