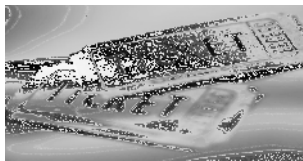

All Soul's Day

This day, November 2nd, begins our month of special remembrance of them. Holy Father establishes "Year for Priests"

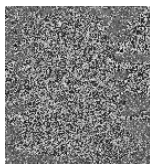
